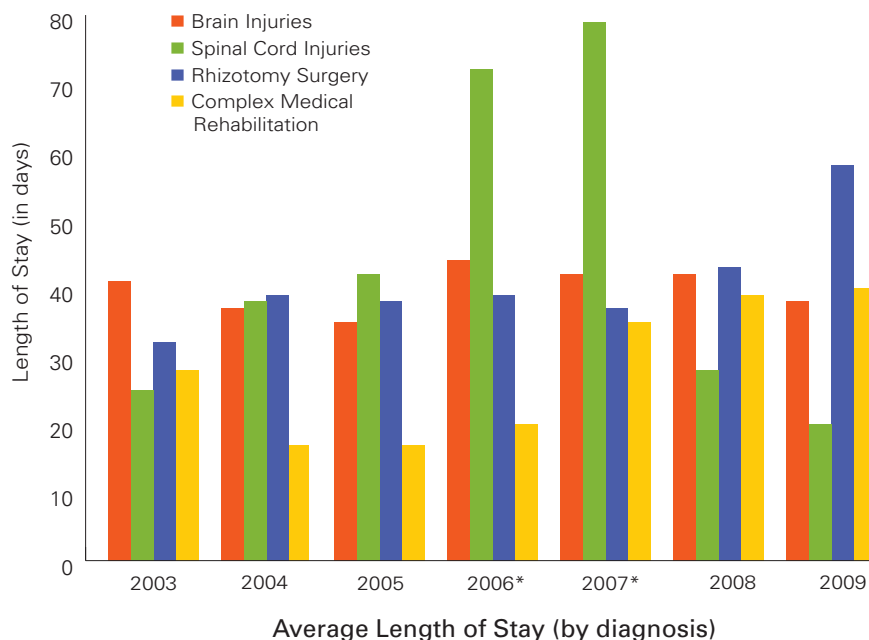
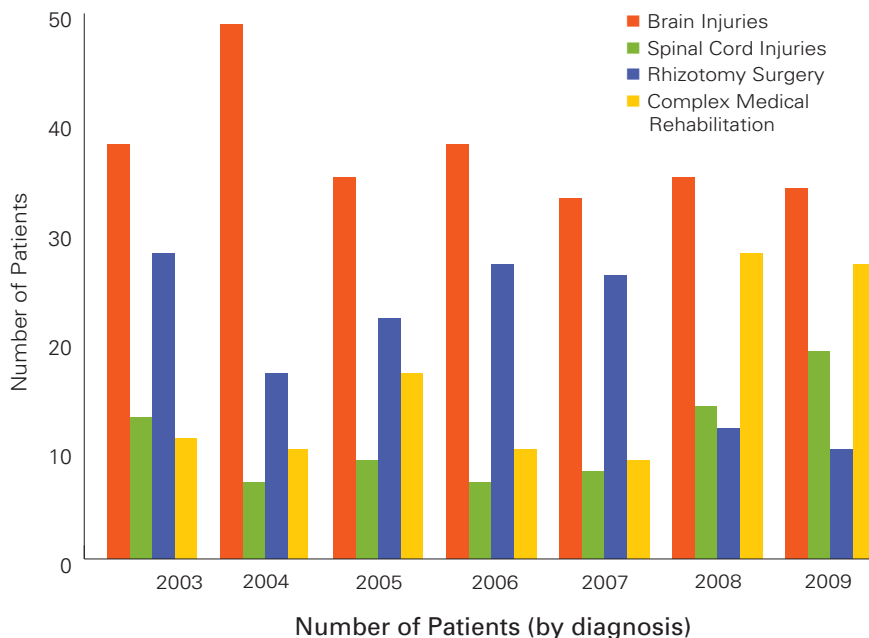

At our Center for Pediatric Rehabilitation, Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare treats children and teens who need rehabilitative care as a result of:

- Brain injuries
- Spinal cord injuries
- Selective dorsal rhizotomy surgery
- Complex medical rehabilitation needs

We've provided you with this information sheet so that you can quickly learn a little more about our services.

Graph 1 shows how many rehabilitation patients we've admitted each year since 2003. Graph 2 shows, on average, how long patients with various conditions stay at Gillette for rehabilitative care.

On the other side of this sheet, Graph 3 shows what percentage of rehabilitation patients leave Gillette to go home (rather than to another facility for care). Graphs 4, 5, and 6 show how patients and their families have rated their experiences at Gillette.

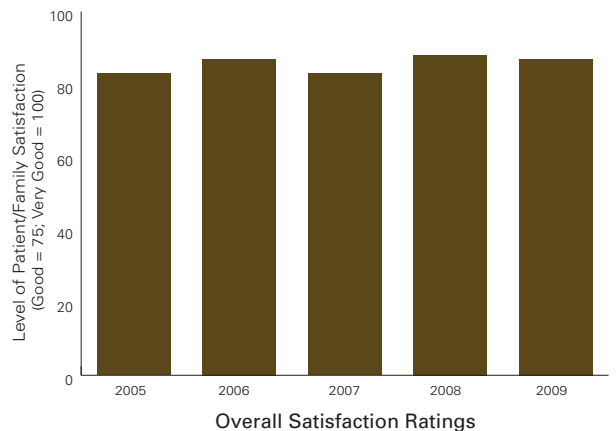

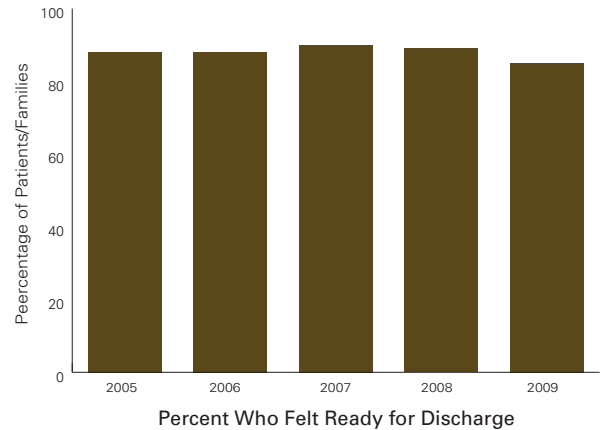
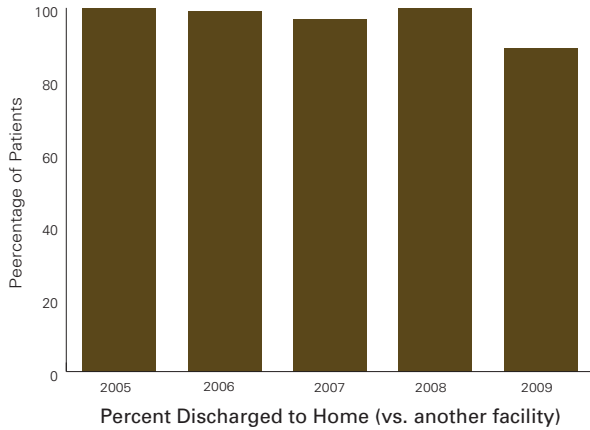
