When to Refer

Conditions Best Seen as Soon as Possible:

Early referral to our Craniofacial and Plastic Surgery team for certain conditions is crucial for optimal outcomes in physical appearance and functional ability.

- Abnormal head shape: determines therapeutic intervention
- Cleft lip and palate: helps feeding strategies and surgical planning
- Craniosynostosis: can prevent potential neurodevelopmental issues
- Ear anomalies: helps plan hearing assessments and reconstruction
- Facial asymmetry or deformities: helps planning corrective procedures
- Vascular anomalies: determines accurate diagnosis and management

Conditions Best Seen Close to 1 Year of Age:

We recommend deferring elective surgical procedures until after 1 year of age to avoid early general anesthesia exposure. We see consults at any age.

- Benign skin lesions
- Capillary malformations / port wine stains
- Dermoid cysts (unless causing functional concern)
- Scar revision
- Syndactyly
- Trigger thumb

Conditions Best Seen in Adolescence

- Gynecomastia
- Macromastia (breast reduction)
- Poland syndrome

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Conditions We Treat

We provide specialized care for various craniofacial conditions, including:

- Birthmarks and vascular anomalies including nevi
- Cleft lip and palate
- Clefts involving the face and eyes
- Craniofacial anomalies associated with congenital syndromes, including 22q11.2 deletion, Apert,
 Pfeiffer, or Treacher-Collins
- Craniosynostosis
- Deformational plagiocephaly
- Ear anomalies including microtia
- Facial asymmetry or differences including hemifacial microsomia
- · Facial injuries and trauma
- Hand differences and abnormalities
- Jaw abnormalities (micrognathia, Pierre Robin, retrognathia)

Signs and Symptoms

Early referral is crucial for optimal outcomes. Watch for these signs and symptoms:

- Feeding difficulties
- Breathing problems
- Speech impairments
- Visible facial deformities
- Developmental delays related to craniofacial structure
